The Enlightenment of Age Block print 30 x 23cm October 2016

*The Enlightenment of Age* was inspired by German Expressionist artists Kollwitz and Pechstein, and the cover of a Nancy Drew novel, *The Secret of Mirror Bay*. As a kid I believed Nancy was witnessing fairies pull something out of the lake. I felt this whimsical image contrasted well against the darker themes of German Expressionism. This piece represents looking back on the changes in your life from an older perspective.

#### The Rebellion of Art

Drypoint 18 x 13cm October 2016

*The Rebellion of Art* represents an uprising against conformity through the contrast of WWII Soviet propaganda and the wild nature of art. The subject featured is from a propaganda poster by Nina Vatolina and is in the same position as another Soviet propaganda poster by an unknown artist that reads, "Go West!"

# **Perceived Epitome**

Block print, overstitching, collage 30.5 x 23cm December 2017

*Perceived Epitome* is a mixed media collage that features the icon of Venus from Botticelli's *The Birth of Venus*. This piece is about the harmful Eurocentric beauty standards that are forced onto people across the world. The collage elements and over stitchings were inspired by Annegret Soltau's series *self* and *bodyopenings*.

# FREE THIS MEAT

Photo series 91 x 61cm November 2016

*FREE THIS MEAT* is a photo series that connects the feelings of gender dysphoria eating someone from the inside to the literal act of eating. It was inspired by Tara Welch's *Rude Cakes* series and uses the style of Keith Haring, a famous LGBT artist. Additionally, it uses the iconography of the pink triangle which is a reclaimed symbol of oppression from the Holocaust.

### Skeletons in the Closet

Block print and digital manipulation 216 x 56cm August 2017

*Skeletons in the Closet* is block print about the epidemic that is LGBT+ teen suicide. It was inspired by pop artists Roy Lichtenstein and Andy Warhol, as well as the 1968 horror movie *Night of the Living Dead* for themes of mass industry and repetition.

### Chrysalis

Digital collage 61 x 61cm September 2017

*Chrysalis* is a digital collage about the abstract growth of teenage years. It was inspired by *Ladder in the Garden* and *Devontay* by Adam Stoner, as well as *Composition VII* by Wassily Kandinsky. Teenagers are often seen as chaotic and moody for no reason, when growth is actually a slow process that we don't have control over.
